Almost all the heroes of Ulugbek Hamdam are people who are struggling to understand themselves, to know the Creator.

THE MAIN FINDINGS AND RESULTS

The book "Ota" ("Father") by Uzbek writer Ulugbek Hamdam is dedicated to all fathers in the world. Human life is like a lamp that goes out when the wind blows. Life is so much a deposit. What will not happen in human life. Now you can lose what you have gained in 1 as a single mistake.

Sevinch was like that. A child who is barely achieved will die as a single mistake. Of course... In order to be happy, you have to sacrifice something. Polat also sacrificed his daughter to have happy days to reach his sweet granddaughter. Sevinch's whole life was ruined as a single burnt face. Happiness is such a wonderful feeling that one does not even know what one has done to achieve it. When it comes to anger, over anger, a person can do things he has never dreamed of. Dad also kills Sevinch in anger. Some areas of the work are impressive. There are different emotions in a single play.

During the war years, Polat also prepared for war to fulfill his youthful duty. At this time, his father Utkir aka also went to war, and his mother Oychechak sister does not want to send his only son to war, but your name is a bitter war, and the mother does not care about tears and so on. In fact, Polat had voluntarily enlisted in the war. Realizing that her sister's resistance would not be of any use, Oychechak began to marry Polat, stipulating that she would either marry or not. Eventually Polat agreed to marry. He married her to his beloved daughter Yogdu Oychechak sister. Polat went to war, where in time he was taken prisoner by the enemy. There was not a day that he did not see, Polat endured and overcame everything, first Allah and then his love for Yagdu saved him. Finally, when the war ended, "ours" won. Polat also returned to his homeland and family in good health. At that time, his father Utkir aka also returned home from the war healthy. The wedding ceremony began at home.

As the fifteenth light of the month and the fifteenth darkness are said to have ended, the feast was over, and on a peaceful day Polat was taken away by the military, and all the captives were taken prisoner as "traitors of the Fatherland." Polat spent eight years in prison and was finally released from prison and returned to his family. Days passed, days passed, months and years passed. For 12 years, Polat and Yogdu had no children, and Oychechak-sister was still a mullah and a fortune-teller. The long-awaited days came when Polat and Yagdu became

Erboy and Polat lived in the same neighborhood, and it was a day of trumpet blasts, wedding watching, and mourning. Erboy's anger intensified. I saw in this play the images of a real father, a loving woman, a reluctant girl. The father's work is dedicated to all fathers.

First of all, reading this work brought tears to my eyes, because the play depicts a generalized image of the real Uzbek fathers. The father's love for his daughter, however hateful, is clearly revealed. The father gives all he has to his daughter, whom he has been waiting for for 15 years, and carries her on his head. As I read, I was once again convinced of the correctness of the idea that man destroys what he loves with his own hands. We can see that the names of the protagonists in the work also have symbolism, and it is not surprising that *Polat is a symbol of patience, Yogdu- shine, Joy-kindness and love.* In the play, some may criticize the father who killed his long-awaited daughter with his own hands, but the girl's father's honor lifts her in her arms for the rest of her life. The only fault of Polat's father was that Yogdu chose him and brought his friend's long-awaited daughter home on the day his wife died. For this he pays a very large tribute. So I think the whole life will be unhappy and even death will cause this event. Here is an excerpt from the play:

Excerpt from the novel: O Lord who created! The life she gave me had two faces, just like my daughter Sevinch's, one of which was very beautiful and the other of which had become ugly.

I know ... Be patient like a stone, May your endurance not be broken, Father! Only rely on the will of the text, only do not be defeated, do not fall Father! Father ... it is no wonder that it is the most blessed, the highest the dearest word in the world for a girl! This is how the great writer Said Ahmad Utkir Hoshimov's work "Dunyoning islari" is described. Every reader who reads this work involuntarily thinks about his mother. By the way, my work "Ota" ("Father") is no exception. "Father" suffers from infertility for 15 years. He cries out to God day and night, wishing for a child. In the desire to see her granddaughter, Oychechak will not be left without a teacher and a fortune teller. it is only because of patience that the god Polat strokes the father and the child with the child who is the flower of heaven. They will have a very beautiful girl, as they say, Allah will beautify her later. The world has always been a low world, and one day a fire will break out in their house. But this fire was a burning fire in Erboy's heart from his youth, and in the end it caught fire, and when it burned, it burned people for the rest of their lives. As you read the work, you may encounter a very strong conflict. Especially at the end of the play, when a

father sees his beloved daughter being killed in the maternity hospital, he says, "You would think that Uzbek fathers would not go so far. But have you ever wondered how my father would behave at that time and in such a situation. Polat father strongly believed in his daughter Sevinch, so he did it. Excerpt from the novel: You sold me! You're done! That's all ... my whole life is wasted!!!

The novel "Ota" ("Father"), which served as an object for this article, is also one of the best examples of modern Uzbek literature. It is difficult to fully analyze these works with one or two researches. Because these works are the product of true paternal thinking, they are very diverse, multi-faceted and multi-layered. Examining them only in terms of spiritual and moral values, the spiritual image of the individual, shows that. In general, Ulugbek Hamdam in his novels raised not only the issues of Uzbekistan during the period of independence, but also the most important issues of human life in general, which are of great importance for all periods.
